

# **Reporting of Critical Lab Results**

## Critical lab results:

Any pathophysiological state that is potentially life-threatening unless something is done promptly to correct it.



## **Responsibilities:**

- All medical staff requesting, reading and entering critical values in the patient medical record.
- Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine



Laboratory results that fall into the critical range **MUST** be immediately reported by telephone to the authorized requestor, or designee, or the appropriate in-patient nurse caring for the patient.

## What to do:

1/When you receive critical results, a **"read back" verification** must be done.

2/The authorized requestor whose name is associated with the order in ICIS has the responsibility to **accept and take appropriate action** for the critical laboratory result.

3/The call receiver should be informed that this is preliminary result that will be **rechecked** by laboratory staff. If the result is different, the staff will be called to inform him about the change of result

## Pathology and Laboratory Medicine staff must call the results according to the following rules:

#### A. Inpatient

Primary Nurse A Nursing Supervisor

#### B. Outpatient, during Working hours

Ordering Physician ⇒ Section Head ⇒ Department Chairman ⇒ MCA

#### C. Outpatient, after working hours

Ordering Physician ⇒ First on Call ⇒ Second on Call (if available)
⇒ Consultant on call ⇒ Section Head ⇒ Dept. Chairman ⇒ MCA

#### C. Emergency/Family Medicine

In charge nurse caring for patient/Physician on duty

## **Documentation of verbal/Phone communication shall follow these requirements**

- Use of two patient identifiers.
- Verbal/Phone communication of results shall be documented immediately in the patient's medical record chart and or ICIS.
