Head Nurse) hold ACLS certification to safely recover GA patients in Endoscopy. Accordingly, patients were being transferred to another floor (Main hospital PACU) for recovery following general anesthesia. 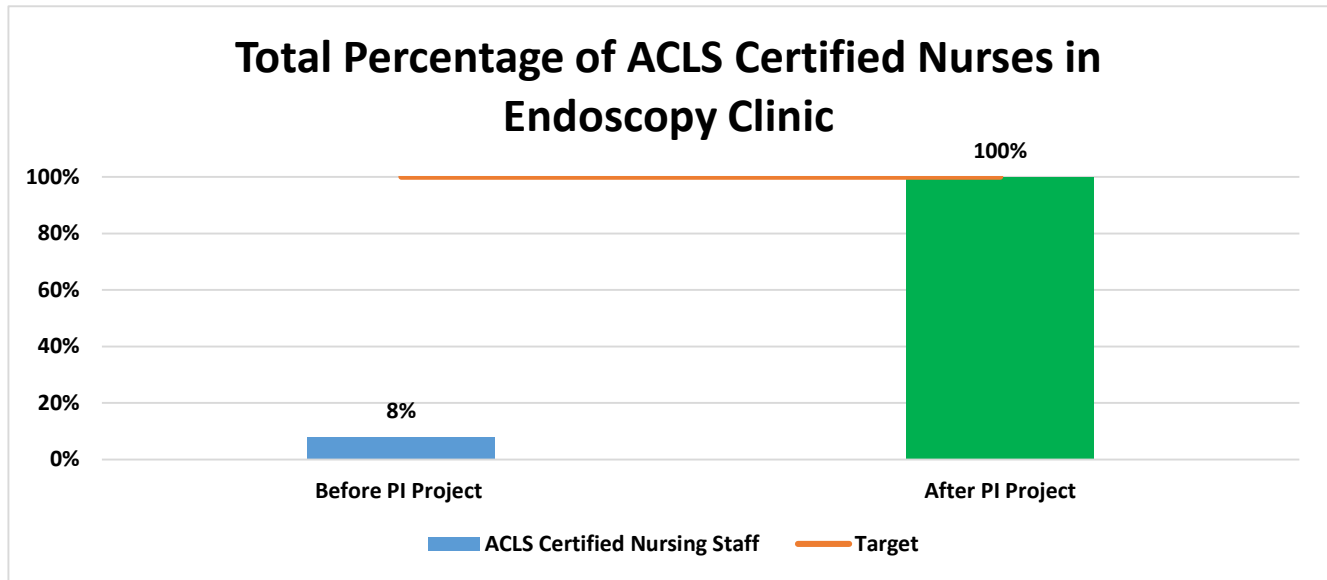
