ASM has updated its Information for Authors and Author Instructions; this has helped in decreasing the number of low-quality submissions such as plagiarized/duplicated studies and studies that lack originality. In addition, the ASM now requires that datasets used in the study be submitted with the manuscript on initial submission, which allows for checking the data analysis and summary statistics. Revisions can also be made to figures and tables to improve the presentation of data.




