Moreover, KFSHRC Riyadh-HCAHPS Benchmark Report for 1st Q 2018 result was below 50th Percentile US Benchmark. Therefore, this project was selected, to enhance patient and family education thru Teach-Back Method.

- Establish a close and open relationship with the patient and family, to promote their well-being and happiness in their journey.

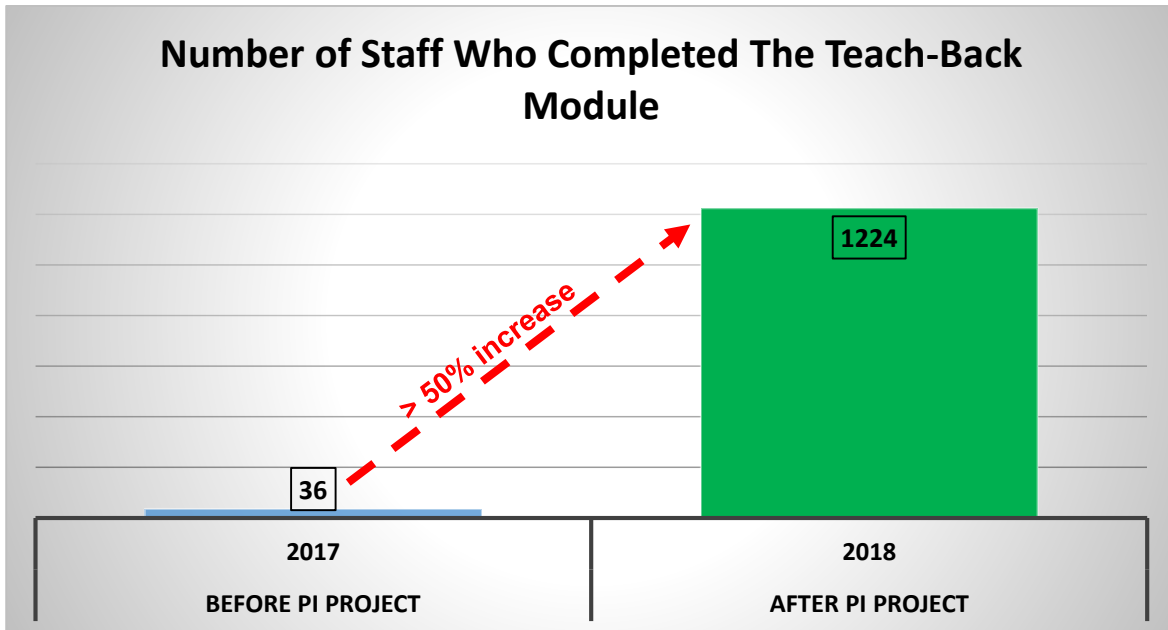
