For a patient who had a CT with contrast order cancellation due to a high creatinine level. After reviewing the past Laboratory tests and requesting to repeat them. The creatinine results came back normal and the required CT Scan was done.

Speak-up for Safety using ARCC (Ask a question, Request a change, Voice a Concern, use Chain of Command), and remember Cross Check will ensure 200% Accountability.
